A Glossary of New Vocabulary for American Ruled Stationery™

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NEW American Ruled Stationery™ (acronym: ARS™) a wand™ **2.** **American** [Goth. *amalrich*, work ruler] having origins in America **3.** **ruling** [ME. *reule* < L. *regula*, ruler] assemblies or citizens ruling in harmony of written speech **4.** **stationery** [ME. *stacionere* < ML. *stationarius*, tradesman with a fixed station or shop + *ery*] material for writing; specifically for letters

Aix™ [Gr.* *Aix*, unknown water bird] a style of American Ruled Stationery in the Atlantic-ward regions of the Roosevelt Tree Wall, derivative of AS™ **biodb.com*, accessed 2026

Aixbook™ [Gr. *Aix*, unknown water bird + ME. *bok*, book] a book containing bound paper imprinted with the Century Update™, equiv. to notebook, SYN. with Pennybook™

As™ [L. *as* (pl. *assis*), roman currency marked with a slanted cross ruled by the god Janus] tribute to the location marker of the Wall of Separation **2.** a style of American Ruled Stationery™, inception of Aix™ & Penny™

As of Grafton Silver™ (SEE As + Grafton) a double-sided wand with As™ on the front side, and Grafton™ on the obverse side **ePistol** [ME. *epistel* < OFr. *epistle* & OE. *epistol*] < L. *epistola*, *epistula* < Gr. *epistolē*, a letter message] the letter message, on ARS, being transmitted **2.** paper size

NEW NYM Grafton™ [G. *graphein*, to write + OE. *tūn*, enclosure, doublet of *graft*, to insert] tribute to the Wall of Separation **2.** a style of American Ruled Stationery™

Kikkar™ [Heb.* plain, loaf of bread, talent (unit of weight)] loose **wands** sold by pound weight **2.** a reference for the Promised land **biblestudytools.com*, accessed 2025

Penny™ [L. *pannus*, cloth used as medium of exchange] a style of American Ruled Stationery™ in the Pacific-ward regions of the Roosevelt Tree Wall, derivative of AS™

Pennybook™ [see PENNY + ME. *bok*, book] a book containing bound wands imprinted with the Century Update™, equiv. to notebook, SYN. Aixbookx™

Silver [OFr. *Silver* < L.* *Sylvarum* (pl.), of the trees, origin unknown as the metal *Argentum*] a whiteish material **2.** a type of paper **Sylva Sylvarum*, Sir Frances Bacon, London 1670

Talent [L. *talentum*, a coin] equiv. to page

Wand [Ger.* *wand*, wall] equiv. to sheet **Webster's German & English Dictionary*, Castle Books, Bantam Books, Inc. © 1981

ARS™ Latitudinal Regions:

Assembly [OFr. *assemblee* < L. *ad-*, to + *simul*, together] prescribed, latitudinal (horizontal) line, carrying the vocht **2.** the commonly blue line used to write straight. NOTE: *The assembly*, referred to as *Feint* in the British dialect, supports the Mister/Mistress's Freedom of the Written Language (speech) as addressed in the United States Constitution.

Canon [ME. <OE. & OFr. < L., measuring line, rule (hence, in ML. (ex.), sacred writings admitted to the catalog according to the rule) <Gr. *kanōn*, rod] a governed area, as ruled by the Bill of Rights, containing an impression of the constitution **2.** a synonymous region equivalent to the vocht

Capital [Latin *capitalis*, of the head <*caput*, the HEAD: see CHIEF] the blank region on top of a talent, equiv. to header **2.** a region which may contain the effect

Constitution [Latin *constituere*, to place together] a pair of assemblies and ruled by the vocht, equiv. to row **Effect** [Latin *efficere*, to bring to pass, accomplish] the capital region containing three assemblies, usually of greater rule **2.** the final area for writing the title, subtitle and precedent vocht **Precedent Vocht** [ME. < MFr. *précédent* < L. *praecedere*: see PRE- & CEDE + *vocht*] the smallest ruled vocht of the effect preceding the main body of writing **2.** the continual title of succeeding talents, equiv. to running script.

Talow [ME* *talow*, rare. inner matter of a seed] the bottom of a talent designated by a thick assembly **2.** inner matter material of the body of writing, equiv. to footnotes. **Middle English Dictionary*, University of Michigan, accessed 2022

Vocht [Du.* *vocht*, liquid, wet] a self-governed, latitudinal region for imprinting the Freedom of the Written Language (speech) **2.** the canon between a prescribed constitution prepared for writing NOTE: Vocht has a diminished "ch," sound, and is a homophone, from Dutch, for "vote," having roots to the English words "feint" and "assembly." **Oxford Languages Dictionary*, accessed 2021

Vocht Canon Rule™ [see VOCHT + CANON] personal ruling size, measurement inside the constitution **2.** the distance from one assembly to the following assembly measured in Pica – equivalent to Points

Quipu or Paleway Quipu [AmSp. *quipu* < Quechua *quipu*, a knot] the missing/blank segments of prescribed, latitudinal assemblies located in the forain paleway **2.** the region used to encrypt authorship, signature, or other message

ARS™ Longitudinal Regions:

Cardinal Phereitels [L. *cardinalis* to turn, hinge + PHEREITEL] the HORZAIN [ONormFr*.] PHEREITEL (North* Phereitel) and FORAIN [ONormFr*.] PHEREITEL (South* Phereitel), equiv. to right and left margin lines, **Old Normandy Compass Rose*

Paleway [Ame. <ME. *palway*, vertical heraldry] vertical space bordering main writing area, equiv. to margin **2.** a designated area for binding purposes NOTE: American Spelling

NEW NYM Phereitel [Gr.* *pherein*, support + *telos*, end] prescribed, supplemental and longitudinal line(s) of the ordinal phereitels **2.** a supporting end for alignments, outlines, layouts, and more. Homophone to fairytale. **new word of non-origin*

Syl [OIr., seed] a pair of prescribed, longitudinal, ruled phereitels containing syllables, and etymologies, etc.

Stenoy [Rus.* *wall*, partition] the centered, and middle of a talent **2.** a syl separating a talent into equal halves, not to be confused with steno **English-Russian Dictionary*, E. P. Dutton & Company, Inc. © 1973

The Region in-between:

Knot [AmInd.* O'je-quack < ?] a prescribed rectangle, naturally formed between syls and constitutions used to syllabicate words, calculate penmanship speed, and more. **Dutch translation*, American Indian source unknown, "Where the Ash Tress grows large knots."
